

### **Contest Details**

#### **Eligibility**

- Applicants must be a high school junior or senior.
- Applicants must be a member, a child or stepchild of a member, or child whose guardian is a member of the Cooperative; or person living in a home where the landlord is a member.
- Applicants must reside in the Cooperative service area, participate in Operation Round Up, and attend a qualifying school. If you are not currently participating in Operation Round Up, we'll automatically enroll you when you submit the Youth Tour application. The qualifying schools are: Abernathy, Anton, Aspermont, Childress, Chillicothe, Coronado, Cotton Center, Crosbyton, Crowell, Estacado, Floydada, Frenship, Guthrie, Hale Center, Idalou, Jayton-Girard, Lorenzo, Lubbock-Cooper, Lubbock, Monterey, Motley Co., New Deal, New Home, Olton, Paducah, Petersburg, Plainview, Post, Quanah, Ralls, Roosevelt, Ropesville, Rotan, Shallowater, Slaton, Southland, Smyer, Spur and Wilson. If you are attending a private school, charter school or are home-schooled, your application will be subject to eligibility verification.
- The trip will take place June 14-22, 2026.

#### **Contest Rules**

- Participants will be required to complete an online application, essay questions and virtual interview.
- Applications and interviews will be judged and four students will be selected as SPEC Youth Tour representatives and Operation Round Up Youth Tour scholarship recipients.

#### **Interview Requirements**

- Applicants will be required to select an interview time when submitting their application. Interviews will take place virtually. You will be contacted prior to your interview with details on how to join the interview online.
- Applicants will have 5-7 minutes of interview time. Possible interview questions are listed on the last page of this document.
- At the time of your interview, please make sure you have a good internet connection and are in a non-distracting, quiet location.

# **Contest Details, continued**

#### **Judging**

- Participants will be judged based on their essay questions, knowledge of subject, how well they present themselves, their speaking ability, appearance, and poise.
- Four students will be selected to represent South Plains Electric Cooperative in Washington, D.C.
- Operation Round Up will be awarding each student selected to represent South Plains Electric Cooperative on the Youth Tour a \$1,500 scholarship. Scholarships will be sent directly to the college of your choice. If a winner is a high school junior, the scholarship will be held until they graduate.

- Virtual Interview Deadline January 15, 2026; 5 p.m.
- Winners will be notified by February 6, 2026; 5 p.m.

- 13. What do you think is the electric cooperative's responsibility in the community?
